

Panavia Tornado ADV F2 kit replacement decals (stencils)

for the old 1/32 scale Revell Panavia Tornado ADV kit #4766

Some 1/32 modellers do still have the old Revell Panavia Tornado ADV F2 kit #4766 that was released in 1985.

Although not very accurate in shape and size, it is the only 1/32 injection moulded kit of the Air Defense Variant F2.

There were some 1/32 resin ADV conversion aftermarket sets top convert the later released 1/32 Revell Tornado IDS kit but this is not an easy task and the resin sets are (now) also rare.

ADV F2 have some special service markings/ stencils and walk ways and obviously squadron markings.

THIS DECALS SET offers REPLACEMENTS of the stencilling of the old Revell kit #4766

Peculiar white walk way lines in 1/32 seen on grey Tornado ADV F2 and F3. Also NO STEPS in white and the alternative NO "foot" STEP symbols are sometimes also seen on ADV Tornado's. These are AVAILABLE in 1/32 decals set #AIPD-01.

The RAF squadron markings as similar in the old Revell Tornado ADV F2 kit# 4766 are AVAILABLE in 1/32 set #AIPD-104.

Though maybe not accurate, the SAUDI ARABIA ADV markings replacements similar as in the kit are AVAILABLE in 1/32 set #AIPD-105.

NOTE that there are also a few 1/32 Tornado decals sets AVAILABLE for the ADV F3 like set #AIPD-02 and also other Tornado's.

DECALS SYSTEM

The laser printed decal sheet has ONE continuous print film, so EACH decal needs to be cut out with fine scissors. No other prior decal preparation is needed.

Note that a decal that contains a white section is often split in two parts. To apply the full decal marking, first set the white decal section at correct position and on top of that the coloured section. On the decals sheet you will often see an "arrow" to indicate this way of application (on white surfaces, the white section is optional).

Each cut out decal can be applied as usual after soaking it a short while in water. Decals are EXTREMELY THIN, so slide off from the wet backing sheet on the model surface. Do not use tweezers! They will fold doubled!



Some tiny white borders may appear at a particular decal. Cut these off with fine scissors or over paint.

After all decals have been applied, finish the model with your preferred final gloss or semi-matt varnish coats. This will also protect the decals.

DECALS description

The decals have numbers that correspond to the Revell Panavia Tornado ADV F2 kit decal numbers. See the drawing.

NOTE that the decals can only be used on "light grey" paint surfaces as seen on Tornado ADV:
upper & sides: Barley grey / BSC Flint grey BS4800-18-B-21 and undersurfaces: Light grey BSC 627.
